CANTON – The Hall of Fame Village powered by Johnson Controls shared aerial photos Tuesday depicting the progress made on the campus.

The photos, posted to Twitter, clearly were taken before snowstorm Izzy dropped more than a foot of snow in the Stark County area Sunday night into Monday morning.

Last month, Hall of Fame Resort & Entertainment Co. announced a partnership with Chicago-based Rush Street Interactive to operate a retail sportsbook at the Hall of Fame Village complex.

They still need the necessary licenses to accept bets on sporting events and pay out winnings to finalize the 10-year agreement.

That, and Tuesday's photos, are another indication that construction at the Hall of Fame Village has accelerated since August 2019 when developers partnered with Gordon Pointe Acquisition Corp.

Combined, they formed Hall of Fame Resort & Entertainment Co.

In addition to the construction around the Pro Football Hall of Fame and Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium, the company acquired and renovated the [DoubleTree by Hilton](#) in downtown Canton. It opened in 2020.
